Link and Grow Mentoring Program 2023



The Link Mentoring Program is a 6-month virtual program that has been co-developed by The Link at ANU, and Franklin Women. The inaugural pilot program in 2023 aims to grow the careers of mid-career culturally diverse (non-Anglo Celtic) women in medicine. The program, which will be facilitated by expert leadership consultants, will also support mentors to better understand the unique experiences of women of colour in the workplace and to become inclusive mentors and leaders.

About the Program

The Link and Grow Mentoring Program combines informal mentoring sessions between mentees and mentors, with structured workshops and events facilitated by leadership experts. The workshops provide career, mentoring and inclusive leadership development of mentees and mentors. They also provide a safe place for participants to network, and to share and reflect on the experiences of culturally diverse women in medicine, and discuss the role of leaders in shifting culture within teams and workplaces.

The inaugural Program will run from May to November 2023, with full schedule and dates found overleaf.

Who can participate?

Mentee

- Individuals who identify as culturally diverse women, and who are at the middle stage of their career (~3-12 years post fellowship), looking for a mentor and peer-support community to grow their careers.
- There is no restriction on discipline.
- Mentees must have capacity to attend all workshops as scheduled and meet informally with their mentor ~6-8 times over the program.
- We expect mentees will want to mentor within the program in future.

Mentor

- Individuals of any gender who are trained in medicine and who are now in leadership roles in the healthcare and health and medical research sector. This includes but is not restricted to clinician researchers, specialist medical practitioners or executives who are committed to inclusive leadership practices.
- Mentors are not required to identify as culturally diverse.
- Mentors must have capacity to attend all workshops scheduled and meet informally with their mentee ~6-8 times over the program.

Connecting mentees with mentors from outside their own discipline and organisation.


